Question one, misrepresentations and omissions.
Did plaintiff prove that defendants made materially
false or misleading statements or omissions on July 22nd, 2014, regarding:

Number one, disease-free survival, DFS, rates?
Answer, yes.
Number two, grade-three plus diarrhea rate?
Answer, no.
Number three, Kaplan-Meier, KM, Curves?
Answer, no.
Number four, discontinuation rate due to adverse events?

Answer, no.
Question two.
Did plaintiff prove that defendants acted knowingly
in making the alleged false or misleading statements or omissions?

Answer, yes.

Question three.
Did plaintiffs prove that the disclosures on
May 13th, 2015, regarding the ExteNET trial DFS rates and grade-three plus diarrhea rate played a substantial part in causing the decline in Puma's stock price on May 14th, 2015?

Answer, yes.
Question 3.2.
Did plaintiffs prove that the disclosures on June 1st, 2015, regarding the ExteNET trial KM curves and discontinuation rate due to adverse events played a substantial part in causing the decline in Puma's stock price on June 1 and 2, 2015?

Answer, no.
Question four.
Specify the amount of damages per share of Puma stock, if any, caused by the disclosures regarding the alleged false or misleading statements or omissions.

Date, May 14 th, $2015, \$ 4.50$, the damages per share.
Question five.
Did defendants prove that plaintiff Norfolk Pension Fund did not actually rely on the integrity of the market price of Puma stock because it would have bought Puma stock at the same price it did even if it had known of the alleged fraud?
Answer, no.

Question 5.2.
Did defendants prove that the alleged false or misleading statements or omissions on July 22nd, 2014, did not affect the market price of Puma's stock?

Answer, no.

Or you may simply walk out, or you may head out into the hallway. Sometimes the attorneys hang out in the hallway and they want to talk to people. You can come back and talk to me and then head out in the hallway after we're finished talking.

So those are your options. I hope to see you in back for just a few moments if you wish.

And let me say to the parties, you know, we have a jury system. The jury has spoken. I know there will be follow-up motions and such, and I look forward to receiving them from all of you.

So we are now in recess on this matter. THE CLERK: All rise.
